Updates from WNAR Initiative, Addressing Sexual Harassment

- WNAR partnered with ENAR to become one of the inaugural members of the Societies Consortium on Sexual Harassment in STEMM. As of January 2020, the Consortium is made up of 123 member societies making a statement about the commitment of STEMM fields to effect change. As part of this Consortium, WNAR has access to standard policies, experts and practical implementation tools to establish expectations for the professional and ethical conduct of all participants at our meetings and events. - The Consortium has been busy the first quarter of 2020 drafting and revising resources for its members. Resources include:

- The Leadership Council hosted a Members' Hot Topics Web Discussion in February in which Societies shared policy development, implementation strategies as well as challenges and solutions. The next web discussion is planned for May.

Additional New WNAR Initiatives

- **WNAR Member Engagement Committee:** In Nov. 2019, the WNAR Executive Committee commissioned an ad hoc Member Engagement Committee to help engage members throughout the year. The first task of the Member Engagement Committee is to establish a WNAR webinar series. The inaugural webinar took place on March 6, 2020 where Prof. Brad Efron from Stanford University gave a lecture on "PREDICTION, ESTIMATION, AND ATTRIBUTION" via zoom. The inaugural webinar was well received with over 200 attendees. A dedicated web page www.wnar.org/webinar was created to host webinar materials. The inaugural webinar video has been viewed over 150 times within one week of its release on YouTube. The Member Engagement Committee is working on future webinars and announcements will be made through WNAR member email list and social media channels including twitter @wnar_ibs. The Industry Liaison Committee is tasked to: (i) create a contact list of members from industry; (ii) provide research topics and facilitate job opportunities for students; (iii) increase collaboration between academia, industry and regulatory authorities; and (iv) deliver a report with strategies for additional activities to foster industry engagement.
